MR. THIELMANN: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
Thank you, Commissioners.
I want to remind this body that they do not have rules for public engagement; therefore, any attempts to stop me or shorten my time to read my statement will be against the law.

I have concerns on the way that the BOR conducts business.

Commissioners, I want to bring your attention to PTAB docket 2020-23559.

Since the BOR becomes the defender of
the values PTAB requires that the BOR produce evidence to support those values.

Under Section 1910.40A under PTAB's rules, one of the requirements is for the Board of Review to provide a property record card.

The BOR is deficient in its
requirement and some law firms have started to request BOR default as a result, as was the case in docket 2020-23559.

Griffin and Associates filed a motion Page 4
with PTAB for a BOR default. The BOR is quick to settle these cases, as to not bring their lack of compliance to light, and the law firms knowing they have the upper hand in the negotiations are fine with that arrangement.

This needs to change immediately as it has the potential to cost taxpayers millions. On the agenda today, you will hear about the hiring of two outside law firms. What they won't tell you is about the third law firm that has been hired to defend the many OMA violations.

The Illinois Attorney General's office has found that the BOR has consistently violated OMA.

Just two weeks ago during a county budget meeting in which the BOR had a majority quorum attend was the latest violation. In all, these three firms have been paid nearly $\$ 500,000$ and counting.

Transparency is just good government. And, in fact, Commissioners Rogers and Cabonargi have the word "transparent" in their bios. That's not what actually happens at the Board of Review.

Commissioner Wendt had to FOIA her own Page 5

1 agency to try to get some answers. I have several FOIAs that are yet to be responded by the BOR.

Today is the C.B.D. oral hearings. I have asked for a list of the hearing schedule and was not given the list as required by Illinois property tax code.

VOICE OF MONITOR: 30 more seconds of public participation.

MR. THIELMANN: I was given a bunch of Docket numbers that have no way of discerning what property is involved.

As a resident, I have an interest in these hearings and by law can attend any I'm concerned about. The BOR intentionally clouds that ability.

Today the BOR will appoint a secretary to fill the role that was open in December of 2021. I FOIA the personnel records of the appointee Jonathan Chapman two weeks ago but have not received the files. I did however receive his red -- hello? Was I muted there?

COMMISSIONER WENDT: Yes.
CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Yes. The period of public participation time period has expired.
Thank you for your comment,
Mr. Thielmann.
You are, just for context, and for the
record --
MR. THIELMANN: Chairman, you don't have a
policy of public participation, you can't silence
me.
CHAIRMAN ROGERS: For context,
Mr. Thielmann is the former Chief of Staff of
Commissioner Wendt, who has been terminated from the
agency.
MR. THIELMANN: There is a --
COMMISSIONER WENDT: Well, I don't know
who is silencing him, but he's correct that there is
no policy in place. I tried to put that in place at
the last meeting and was supposed to receive some
proposals before today and never did. So I said at
the last meeting we needed a public policy --
participation policy and we don't have one. And it
was never presented to me or the other
commissioners. And I said this could be the Wild
West if we don't have one and it's against the law
if we cut people off.
So for the record, those are my

1 statements.

I will -- I will report on that. I apologize. Give me one second here. Here.

Just by way of context, as has been reported in the press and as we have discussed at prior meetings, last fall the Board retained Riley Safer Holmes and Cancila, LLP to conduct an internal investigation following a Chicago Sun Times report that a board employee had solicited bribes in exchange for reduced assessments. This was a board employee that was hired and worked at the Board long before any of the current sitting commissioners were elected to serve.

The Board was obviously very concerned with respect to the report and moved very quickly to retain counsel to conduct a complete investigation of both the matters reported by the Sun Times as well as a comprehensive review of the Board's compliance functions.

The firm is completing its work and plans to report to the commissioner soon with respect to its findings. While the firm interviewed Page 9

1 a number of board employees and reviewed a broad 2 range of documents, we wanted to ensure that the and not to the Board of Review. Again, if you would like to share any information and that's anyone, please contact our outside counsel Riley Safer Holmes and Cancila, LLP at (312) 471-8671. Again, that is a direct line to the outside counsel in charge of this investigation not to the Board of Review.

1 thought that's what we were doing today.
